

Position: Lethality Assessment Protocol (LAP) Program Intern

Reports to: LAP Program Manager

Classification: 10-12 hrs/week, hybrid remote/in-person in Chapel Hill, unpaid

The LAP Program Intern will provide direct client support to domestic violence victims referred to Compass Center through the LAP program, providing brief supportive crisis counseling, safety planning, shelter referrals, and information about domestic violence protective orders and community resources according to LAP protocol. The LAP Program intern will also assist in coordinating follow-ups for victims who consent to follow-up and will support the administrative and data needs of the program alongside the LAP Program Manager.

Core Responsibilities (10-12 hours/week)

- Approximately 3 weekly daytime shifts providing brief crisis support according to LAP protocol on the LAP line during business hours (shifts are typically 9-1pm or 1-5pm but can be adjusted as needed)
- Assist the team in completing next-day LAP follow-up calls for weekend/overnight LAP referrals and coordinating resources/supports
- Meet with LAP clients in-office when they are scheduled to come in after LAP referral (as schedule allows)
- Attend supervision as needed with LAP Program Manager
- Communicate with Law Enforcement LAP Coordinators
- Assist with LAP data entry and tracking in Apricot and Forseti systems
- Support initial and refresher LAP training efforts as available
- Maintain statistical records and proper documentation on clients served

Intern Requirements:

- Available to intern Summer 2025 (May-August), ideally with interest in continuing through 25-26 school year
- Preference for students pursuing a degree in a human services/social justice related field (i.e. political science, women's studies, pre-law, psychology, social work, etc.) OR equivalent experience
- Comfort talking to and assisting individuals in crisis around issues including but not limited to physical, emotional, psychological, sexual, and financial abuse
- Comfort working with all people who enter Compass Center, regardless of race, creed, color, national origin, age, gender, disability, sexual orientation, or gender identity
- Commitment to racial equity and anti-racism
- Willing to complete LAP training and shadowing facilitated by Compass Center
- Spanish fluency preferred but not required
